
• Both Gericks Cycle and Sacred Ride have talked about the previous membership discount of 10% bike parts and accessories and would like to communicate to the membership some changes to the program...

As the retail world changes and online retailers become more price aggressive our pricing has also changed to reflect that. Our regular prices no longer have room for automatic discounts to members for all items. As in previous years Labor is not applicable to any discounts

Both shops are committed to cycling club members and the community and do many things throughout the year to support the cycling community. The 5er rides, group rides, demo bikes/demo days and many volunteer hours to various club activities and events.

• We will continue to offer a 10% discount on select bike accessories whenever possible. In general bike accessories are things you wear. For example, gloves, jerseys, shorts and shoes. We can no longer offer 10% off on bike parts. Parts being things that make your bike work. For example, tires, brake pads, handlebars.



Mountain Station Signage Project

- All Mtn Stn trails –but the Vein –are located on private land owned by Anderson Creek Timber.
- Landowners required liability insurance which we purchased in August 2006 for \$1,000.
- For risk management purposes we are compelled to sign trails (location and difficulty) and hazards
- · Helpful for new riders, new residents, and tourists
- Co-operative project with Anderson Ck Timber Projects financed (\$2,300) by RDCK Area F and E and the City of Nelson




Map Books




